
SANITATION DISPOSAL GUIDELINES FOR SEWER LINES

THERE ARE ONLY TWO THINGS THAT GET FLUSHED DOWN THE TOILET:

1. Human waste (feces, urine)
2. Toilet paper

THINGS THAT YOU SHOULD NOT FLUSH INCLUDE:

- Disposable diapers
- Tampons and tampon applicators
- Sanitary napkins
- Cotton balls and swabs
- Mini or maxi pads
- Condoms
- Cleaning wipes of any kind
- Facial tissue
- Bandages and bandage wrappings
- Automotive fluids
- Paint solvents, sealants and thinners
- Poisons and hazardous waste
- Pet poop
